<b>Economic Status:</b>	Panama's dollarized economy rests primarily on a well-developed services sector that accounts for three-fourths of GDP. Not a CAFTA signatory, Panama in December 2006 independently negotiated a free trade agreement with the US, which, when implemented, will help promote the country's economic growth.
<b>Security:</b>	An amendment to the Constitution abolished the armed forces, but there are security forces (Panamanian Public Forces or PPF includes the Panamanian National Police, National Maritime Service, and National Air Service).
